The latter, first published and copyrighted with music in 1879 by John Poage Williamson and Alfred Longley Riggs, Editors, states that "This is the fifth revision and enlargement of our Dakota Hymn Book," which refers to Dakota dowanpi kin .

This hymn was originally written in 1842 in the Dakota Native American language by Joseph R. Renville. Its Dakota title is "Wakantanka taku nitawa". The original text is based on Jeremiah 10:12-13. It was first published in 1879 in the Dakota Odowan, a significant hymnal in the Dakota language.

Dakota Odowan is still used today. It contains primarily 19th-century English hymnody in translation, hymns that the Presbyterian missionaries would have known. A words-only edition appeared in 1841, and a music edition appeared sometime after 1854.
