## **GUIDELINES: Integrating Indigenous Knowledge in Project ...**

Indigenous knowledge is the basis for local level decision-making in food security, human and animal health, education, NRM, and other vital economic and social activities. Agricultural and social scientists have been aware of the existence of IK since colonial times, but from the early 1980s understanding of farmers' practices as rational and valid has rapidly gained ground.

## **Why indigenous knowledge has a place in the school science ...**

### **The use of indigenous knowledge in development: problems ...**

There have been robust debates on the integration of indigenous education into national curricula (Nozaki, 2014; Breidlid, 2013, 2012) and initial attempts to include indigenous knowledge in the

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curriculum have sometimes met with resistance from different people who have varied views about the specific knowledge items which should be included (Hodson, 2009).

### **Back to Basics: Integrating African Indigenous Education ...**

The integration of African indigenous knowledge systems (AIKS) into the higher educational system could improve its relevance. This is due to the holistic, community-based nature and approach of AIKS to education and knowledge production.

### **African indigenous knowledge systems and relevance of ...**

The central focus of the AKRSI strategy has been the fostering of connectivity and complementarity between two functionally interdependent but historically disconnected and alienated complex systems—the Indigenous knowledge systems rooted in the Native cultures that inhabit rural Alaska, and the formal education systems that have been imported to ostensibly serve the educational needs of Native communities.
