National Drug Code Directory | FDA

The National Drug Code or NDC is a unique numeric identifier given to medications. The National Drug Code is divided in numeric 3-segments. The first segment identifies the product labeler (i.e., the manufacturer, marketer, repackager or distributor of the product). The second segment identifies the product itself (i.e., drug specific strength, dosage form, and drug formula).

The NDC is maintained by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA). NDC codes are unique and consist of 11 numeric character divided in 3 segments that identify the labeler (vendor), product and trade package of each drug.
